I use Picasa, which is a free and simple form of many other more complicated and exacting programmes available. Besides the editing programme it also allows me to keep all my images together, allows copies to be made and also gives a myriad of separate sections whereby one can group similar works from different dates and themes to be grouped to create an album....over and over again.

Many Photographers do not like the programme as it 'grabs' all photographs which you enter/download into the computer, so be aware of this.

I shall be demonstrating some of the features of this programme later in the year should you be interested in 'dipping your toe' into this simpler form of editing.

The images enclosed indicate the possibilities of utilising both over and beyond our normal tasks which we are encouraged to enter but I thought to indicate alternative uses for the camera, a useful extension and an additive use to the 'edited' images enclosed.

That we have joined this wonderful association with members who offers us such support is without a doubt gratifying and so it is important that we take these opportunities and enrich the mix by adding our entries to those competitions which are offered every 2nd month.... even if we feel inadequate to the task. We learn by comparisons as equals, and it is good to remember that the judgements conferred are offered as an encouragement not as a demeaning critique.

We had 20 members and associates attend our first trip for the year. Starting with everyone going off for a variety of takeaways, then meeting back at the footbridge to eat together.



We took photos of jetties, boats, people, birds.

We walked over to the surf beach to get the setting sun on the wet sand, while trying to get slow water from the crashing waves.

There was a lot of sea mist and people on the beach, so I am sure some people will have some great shots.








Then we headed back across the bridge to photograph the carnival with reflections in the water at night.

Mary Sowa, along with several other people, experimented with existing light photography until she captured the full circle of the light of the Carnival display of one of the rides. To capture the movement, she left the shutter open and placed the camera on a tripod. Observe the blue effect, when she changed the White Balance from Auto to "incandescent".

Contrast the full circle with what was visible to the eye (taken by Barbara Rogalla), where the camera settings were on Auto, ISO 1600, camera hand held.








For the next three photos (note the change in White Balance), Mary experimented with severely cropping the images, to make them fit the rule of thirds for composition. As she recalls, all of these photos were shot at ISO 100; F36 and 1 or 2 seconds.

One for the Bookworms

The East Gippsland Shire Council library currently has about 10 books on photography. See current list below.

Feel the Cold

This assignment challenges you to produce a photograph that evokes that feeling in others. Your image must make your audience to shiver, have cold hands, toes and noses. Make them wish they were inside by a roaring fire. Consider ways you can use composition, perspective, light, color, and texture to express this feeling. Sometimes feeling cold is exhilarating, sometimes it's uncomfortable; but it's a feeling you can share if you do it right.
